The Rocky Top Ranch Petting Zoo will be at the county fair all three days, Friday and Saturday noon to 8 p.m. and Sunday, noon to 5:30 p.m.

Parade brings fun to downtown

While many events get going Friday at the fairgrounds, downtown Underwood will be busy Saturday just before noon as folks start lining up along Lincoln Ave. to take in the McLean County Fair Parade. The Grand Marshal will be Vince Iglehart, the 2023 Heartland Association of Fairs, Fair Person of the Year, line up starts at 11 am.

It's a BYOBFC (bring your own bag for candy) event for the kiddies, as they're encouraged to also wait along the street as the parade participants make their way through the parade route that starts at the McLean County Fairgrounds and makes its way down Lincoln Ave.

This is the 67th annual fair, and the parade promises to be filled with classic cars, buggies, antique

tractors, horseback riders, fire trucks, military vehicles, and business and organization floats.

It's time for organizations to put their crepe paper and chicken wire skills to work again, as county organizations and businesses are encouraged to enter the parade. What a perfect way to get your business or organization name out to the public and get involved with locals from throughout the county.

Units will assemble at the fairgrounds entrance on old Highway 83 bypass loop at 11 a.m., and the parade will start at noon.

The parade route begins at the fairgrounds and travels down Underwood's Lincoln Ave. and back to the fairgrounds along McLean County Road 14.

Cowboy Olympics

If there's one thing that the McLean County Fair is focused on, it is its children – kids and their projects, kids on carnival rides, kids playing games and kids just generally having a great time being kids.

The always popular Kids Coin Hunt is on tap Friday and Saturday of the fair, giving kids from itty bitty to pre-teen an opportunity to dig through piles of straw to find some hidden silver. Friday's coin hunt starts at 4 p.m. near the livestock barn, and Saturday's hunt starts at 2:30 p.m.

You never know exactly what they'll come up with for the Kids Farmer Olympics, but you're guaranteed to have a good time

watching the young'uns compete in wild and wacky races. The Kids Farmer Olympics will get underway at 4 p.m. Saturday. (You'll want to stick around to see how the adults handle the Kids Farmer Olympics, starting at 8 p.m., so it will be kids' chance to laugh at the adults!)

Undoubtedly one of the biggest draws to the fair each year is the Kiddy Tractor Pull, which challenges children of all ages to see how much weight they can pull behind a pedal tractor. Prizes are given in several different age divisions.

Registration for the event starts at 6 p.m. Saturday, and the competition starts at 6:30 p.m. near the main exhibit hall.



Hear the roar, enjoy the race

The McLean County Speedway will be the place to be Friday and Saturday during the fair.

In case you haven't seen it, the Speedway has been upgraded with new bleachers, new restrooms, a new concessions area and new lights that ensure everyone can see every minute of the racing.

Friday features late models, wingless sprints and other classes, all for sizable payouts. The fun starts

at 7 p.m. The same fun is available starting at 6 p.m. Saturday.

Featuring payouts to the winners on Friday and Saturday, the races will feature late model racers.

The track is fast becoming one of the most popular oval dirt tracks in not just the state, but the upper Midwest. It's a place where racers, race fans and gonna-be-race-fans are welcomed to enjoy the fast paced action.

Rummage through the city

Not only is there an inviting fair in town, but there are rummage sales too. Underwood's city-wide rummage sales will be Friday and Saturday.

The rummage sale is a terrific place to switch out your decor, pick up clothing and toys or just find a treasure you didn't know you were looking for. For a lot of people, the annual city-wide rummage sale is a can't-miss day of shopping, and for many has become a family tradition.

The Underwood Civic Club sponsors the annual city-wide rummage sale, and civic club members encourage folks to stop in at the local businesses to check out the treasures they'll find at the businesses.

After all that rummage sale shopping, you might find yourself wanting to cool off with a nice cooling old-fashioned soda or a scrumptious malt, an iced cappuccino, or even a quick meal.

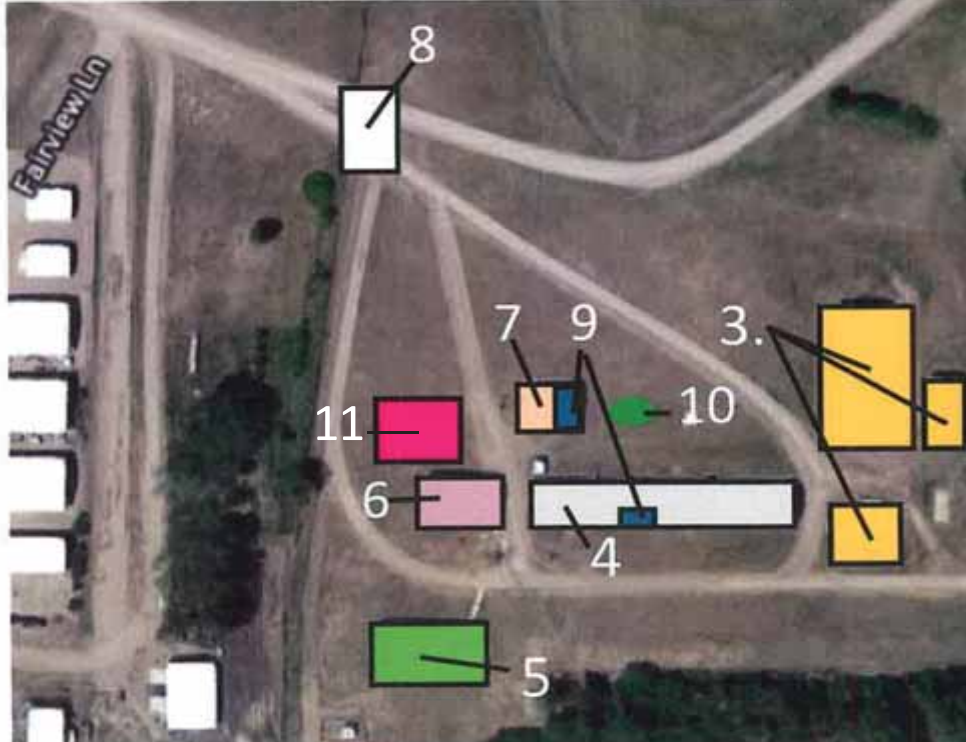

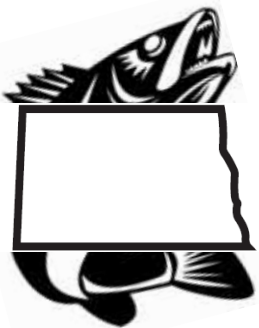

Livestock, exhibits give FFA, 4-H chance to shine

Two staples of rural North Dakota youths' lives take center stage during the McLean County Fair, as the 4-H youth and FFA students have the opportunity to face the judges, and each other.

They'll be vying for top honors at the annual 4-H Day, which is held Friday, with registration for the static judging from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

There will be 4-H, an open class rabbit, livestock judging, a livestock show and a horse show.

The youth have spent days, weeks, months, and sometimes even years on these projects/animals. The fair is their opportunity to show off all of their hard work, and what they've learned through their work with 4-H and FFA. Top honors of Grand Champion and Reserved Grand Champion ribbons will be awarded to the top competitors, while others will receive other ribbons deemed appropriate by the judges.

The North Dakota Junior Points Show where youth will show off their prize cattle, sheep, goats and swine will be held bright and early at 8 a.m. Sunday, while the Cloverbud livestock parade, 4-H and FFA

livestock premium sale, and 4-H awards are all set to get underway at 3 p.m.

The 4-H and FFA static exhibits will be open for public viewing following the judging through Sunday at 5:30 p.m.

The youth have spent hours working with their animals to make sure they are in tip-top shape for the judges. They're not just pets or show animals – most times, they're members of the family.

Walking through the barns where the cattle, hogs, sheep and goats are housed, and taking a little stroll through the area where the kids keep their chickens, geese and bunnies during the fair reminds one how important livestock is to not just these kids, but to the livelihood of North Dakota's farm families.
