Cardinals preparing to fly into the season

Washburn/Wilton/ As the Center-Stanton Cardinals baseball team prepares for the 2024 season, it will look to build on the success that the team experienced last year to help propel the team to even greater heights this year. "We have a team of 20 kids this year for JV and Varsity combined" Coach Travis Stevens said. The Cardinals, who lost two key players to graduation last year, will look to this year's seniors Alex Retterath, Carter Knutson, Jarret Henke and Hunter Hoffman for leadership during the upcoming battles. Stevens also highlighted his group of talented juniors, "we have a very heavy junior class, with a lot of those juniors having significant playing time last season" Stevens said.

Because of the reliance in the previous year on the incoming juniors, Stevens envisions the Cardinals lineup looking relatively the same as last year. "I see us having much of the same lineup as last year. There were a few guys who got on a hot streak to end the year last year that will get their chance to start out this season. There are a few jobs open and I have full confidence in multiple guys fighting for those two spots that we graduated out last season. This is going to be a good problem to have" Stevens added.

Stevens feels that the team's strength this year will come from their fundamentals on defense. "It's our team's goal to be fundamentally sound on defense and make the routine play, we harp on these things and spend a significant amount of time working on the basics of defense every day" Stevens said.

Pitching should also be a strength for the Cardinals as they return many players who had success when they hopped on the bump last year. "Our pitching staff I believe will have a great time this

year as well. We graduated our ace last year but we had so much bullpen and support staff around him that these guys already have the innings under their belt" Stevens

As for a team weakness, Stevens felt that hitting could pose a problem, at least early in the season. "As for weaknesses, I think the obvious one goes to hitting early on in the season. Being inside is always tough but I have a feeling once we get outside and see some live pitching, we will be just fine when it comes to the bats" he stated.

Stevens noted that as a co-op team, unity is often one area that can be a challenge, at least early in the season. "I'm hoping to see our team grow as one over the season. Baseball is always a funny time, especially as a co-op. Division and regional basketball just ends, and we have all played each other and competed against each other. I think our team does a great job in coming together once baseball starts and we are not 4 schools anymore but 1 team. Other than the team aspect I hope to see them grow in how they can relate baseball and the things we do to their future outside of sports" Stevens

For the upcoming year, Stevens

noted that the Cards would be especially looking forward to facing off with region rivals Hazen and Shiloh Christian again this year. "Every team in our conference is exciting to play and can give a great game on any given day. But I think some games circled on our calendar are Hazen, as we only finally got them in the district tournament last year, and Shiloh of course. We showed last year we can compete and hang with the best in the state and that is exactly where Shiloh sits. I think a lot of our returners have a bad taste in their mouth over the district championship game where we got 10run ruled but with all of those runs coming after the wheels came off in the 6th inning" Stevens added.

Ultimately, the Cardinals will look to take all off the experience that they have acquired over the past year and put all together in an effort to achieve their season goals. "I think our ultimate goal for the season is to play our best game, limiting what other teams can do by being fundamentally sound, playing as one, and playing smart.
