






25 FORT STEVENSON STATE PARK

27 HAZEN GOLF COURSE

The Hazen Golf Club is located along Hwy 200 a half mile east of Hazen, ND. The course is a 9-hole regulation length golf course situated along the Knife River that offers scenic holes with mature trees and rolling greens. This short layout has three sets of tee boxes for a fun, but challenging golfing experience for the whole family.

The course is not long at 2800 yards, par 35, but offers many challenging approach shots. The toughest hole here is the #1 handicap par 3 they call "The Shortest Par Five in North Dakota."

28 FLEA MARKET

In June, Hazen will have an excellent chance to do some summertime shopping in the beautiful outdoors. On June 1, Hazen will hold a Flea Market on East Main Street from Hazen City Hall to Heritage Park. A variety of vendors will be making everything from glassware to macrame plant hangers to soap and lotions to baked goods, as well as chuck wagons with all the fixings. For whatever your summer needs, the Flea Market will be the place to be. In addition, for the second year a fun Roll-a-Rama event will be held alongside the Flea Market, starting at 4 p.m.

29 HAZEN BAY RECREATION AREA

If you want to enjoy the outdoors, the Hazen Bay Recreation Area, located 15 miles due north of Hazen on County Road 27, is the ideal place for you. The campground includes 95 full-site hook-ups, 25 sites with water and electric service, three sites with simple electric service, six primitive camp sites for diehard campers and six rental cabins (4 fully furnished and 2 primitive). Playgrounds and picnic shelters also offer locations to relax. Boat ramps and a fish cleaning station are also available for use by boaters and anglers. Hazen Bay also has two comfort stations and a convenience store.

30 BIKING & HIKING

The Hazen area provides numerous opportunities for bikers and hikers to get around. Trails currently run parallel to Highway 200 from near Jimmy's Lounge to the golf clubhouse, as well as from Krause's Market east toward downtown. There are parks located along these trails as well. The Knife River Indian Villages National Park and Lake Sakakawea State Park are also less than an hour's drive away, featuring options for avid hikers.

31 HARMONY LAKE

Harmony Lake is located six miles north of Hazen. While the big lake north occupies the most attention, there's another prime destination, halfway between Lake Sakakawea and the City of Hazen. Harmony Lake is the result of a recreational lake being established after Coteau Properties finished its mining operations in that area. At 38 acres in size, the man-made lake is stocked with bluegill, largemouth bass and fathead minnows for anglers and has a concrete boat dock for easy access located near the main vehicle entrance. Boats and other watercraft may use electric motors only. The winding lake and road alongside also provide a great opportunity for birders, hikers and anyone wanting to take advantage of a sunny day.




32 MUSICAL EVENTS



44 AREA POWWOWS

The rhythm of drums calls to the soul as singers raise their voices with words that are as ancient as the hills or young as a new child. From the muted tones of the traditional dancers to the kaleidoscope that makes up the costumes of the fancy dancers, Powwows are a feast for the senses.

The Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara people have lived in the Missouri River Valley for centuries. The powwows are a connection to that past when peoples from hundreds of miles around came to the river to trade and celebrate the prairie's abundance. Powwows are also a time for special ceremonies to welcome new members into families and clans and remember those who have passed away.

Every reservation community on Fort Berthold holds at least one powwow during the summer. Powwows generally start Thursday evenings and go all day Friday and Saturday. The largest powwows on the Fort Berthold Reservation are:

45 **STAY IN AN AUTHENTIC EARTH LODGE**

The tribes of the Upper Missouri, the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara, built great cities centuries before Europeans came to North America. The River was sacred to the people and was also center of trade that stretched from the Gulf of Mexico to what is now Canada. In these cities, the people lived in Earth Lodges, buildings framed with huge cottonwood logs from the river and covered with finely woven branches and hides. Then the lodges were given a thick covering of the rich prairie soil that held back winter's biting chill and stayed cool in the heat of summer.

Today, tourist can experience the hospitality that Lewis and Clark enjoyed on their Voyage of Discovery and be welcomed at an Earth Lodge Village. Six miles west of New Town, on the shore of Lake Sakakawea, sits a small Earth Lodge Village that recreates those historical moments. The Village has six family sized lodges that can be rented and is also home to tipi encampments. The large ceremonial lodge which was completely rebuilt over the winter hosts storytelling and other cultural events.

Visitors can also drop in for a cultural tour, hiking, kayaking or horseback riding. Bikes and kayaks can be rented as well. The Earth Lodge Village is also the host of the exciting Warrior of the Plains race every summer. Visitors can also learn from the village's traditional garden, which grows ancient varieties of beans, corn, sunflowers and other traditional foods.

The Three Affiliated Tribes Museum is located on one of the most picturesque sites of North Dakota. Framed by the legendary Missouri River (now Lake Sakakawea) to the east and north and by historic buttes to the south and west, it is in a timeless corridor of history.

More than 12,000 years ago, early man found this area to be a good camping site, a place to hunt the ancient bison needed for survival. Today, modern man still enjoys camping out and tossing a line or two in the Missouri in hopes of catching his evening meal of mouth-watering walleye.

Dedicated to preserving and interpreting the history and tradition of the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara people, the Museum houses a large collection of artifacts, photographs, archives, artwork, oral history and other items of cultural significance.

Exhibits of both traditional and contemporary subjects range from 19th century apparel to modern-day graphic arts. Several monuments are housed outdoors on the lawn of the Museum. These include the Fort Laramie Monument, the Veterans Monument, the Fallen Soldier Monument and the Lewis and Clark Peace and Friendship Monument erected by the North Dakota Surveyors Association.

The museum will be open by Memorial Day. The hours of operation are from 10 a.m.-4 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 1-4 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. 50 TAKE A SCENIC ROAD TRIP

Running through the heart of the regions rich history and its current oil boom, the Killdeer Mountain-Four Bears scenic byway tells the story of North Dakota.

Starting in the south on the banks of the Heart River near Manning, Highway 22 runs north to Killdeer, where Cowboy Country and Oil Country meet. Killdeer offers fishing and hiking at the Lake Ilo Wildlife Refuge. Travelers can wet their whistle and get a hearty meal at the Buckhorn Saloon. Just north of Killdeer is the Killdeer Mountain Battlefield State Historic Site which commemorates a battle fought on July 28, 1864, between troops commanded by General Sully and a gathering of Teton, Yanktonai, and Dakota (Sioux) Indians.

Some of the most picturesque Badlands scenery can be found at Little Missouri State Park. Most of this primitive park is accessible only on foot or horseback. Wind, water and sand ... these components sculpted North Dakota's wildly rugged Little Missouri Breaks Country. Called "Mako Shika" or "where the land breaks" by the Sioux, these unusual land formations offer the state's most awe-inspiring scenery. The park is located 15 miles south of Mandaree.


Just north of the park, the byway winds north through rugged badlands crossing the Little Missouri River at Lost Bridge. The Lost Bridge was built in the early 1930s. A road to the bridge was not built until twenty years later, hence the name. The Lost Bridge was dismantled in 1994. A plaque and a piece of the old bridge have been installed on Highway 22 near the new ridge as a memorial.

Mandaree is the hub of the West Segment of the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara Nation. There are many cultural events throughout the summer.. The community holds a festive Fourth of July celebration every year. The Mandaree Powwow grounds is the home of the Mandaree Celebration held on July 13-16 this summer.

The trip concludes at Four Bears, on the shores of Lake Sakakawea. Stops at the end of the road include the Three Affiliated Tribes Museum, the Four Bears Casino and Lodge, Four Bears Water Park, the spectacular Four Bears Bridge and the Crow Flies High Butte Scenic Overlook. Just across the bridge is historic New Town, with dining options including Teddy's Lounge, Better B's, JC Java Coffeeshop, TDH Cafe and more.



Compare the size of the vehicles you drive, or even the largest piece of machinery you've ever driven, with the vehicles that are driven (or "walked" as in the case of the immense draglines) in the massive mining operation. June through August, walk-in tours for small groups are welcome. Large group tours are by appointment only. To ensure the mine is open for tours, please call ahead of time. If a tour isn't available, often the massive equipment, including the drag line, can be seen right along US 83 at Underwood.



87 REMEMBER THE PIONEERS

The Pioneer Museum of McKenzie County packs a whole lot of history into a small area. From the exhibit on the last lynching in North Dakota to the replica of a pioneer home, the museum accurately depicts a large part of Watford City's and McKenzie County's history.

Visitors can follow the lives of the pioneers through a series of 14 historical wall panels that chronicle the dreams and aspirations of the first farmers, ranchers and townspeople to come to the area. Learn why whole families chose to leave their homes and settle in a new, wild country. Experience the joys and hardships of early life on the Great Plains.

You will be surprised to see a few new things at our museum especially the expanded (doubled the size of this area!) and renovated lower level where we are largely exploring the economic development of McKenzie County. New and featured oil history exhibits showcasing then and particularly now (nothing else like this in the State of North Dakota), and of course the ranching and farming history with a then and now twist. We did not forget the kiddos! An area where they can learn about farming, seeds and the Very Hungry McKenzie County Caterpillar! There are a couple finishing touches that will be added, but largely completed.

Add the fully stocked gift shop to the Pioneer Museum experience and you will have a very enjoyable time! We stock Theodore Roosevelt National Park items, t-shirts, Carrie Carson Pottery, and Barb Boltz Crafty Products. So lots to take a peek at!

The Parlor, on the upper level of the museum, has all the comforts of home. It includes an Honor Display dedicated to the Pioneer Women of McKenzie County. Some of the exhibits in the Parlor include Clothing Styles of Yesteryear, Prairie School, Sewing and Quilting, Homestead Living and an Old Time Photo Collection. On the lower lever there is a traveling exhibit room and displays on Early Farming and Ranching and Oil and Gas Exploration.

A special exhibit documents one of the darker moments in the county's history. Charles Bannon murdered the Albert Haven family in February 1930. He was taken from the local jail by a mob and hanged from the Schafer Bridge on January 29, 1931. This was the last recorded lynching in North Dakota.

The museum is located in the Long X Visitors Center, Corner of U.S. Highway. 85 South & West, Watford City. Stop by Grandma's Pantry & Book Corner on the main floor of the Visitor Center. Open 10 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday thru Saturday. Admission is \$2 for adults and \$1 for children. Group rates and special passes are available. For more information call 701-444-2990.

Two rare fish species, the pallid sturgeon and the prehistoric-looking paddlefish, can occasionally be found in the lake's western reaches.
