

1 CAMPING

The south side of Lake Sakakawea has plenty of camping options open for the outdoors-oriented adventurers out there. From Lake Sakakawea State Park near Pick City in the eastern portion of the county through Hazen Bay, Beulah Bay, Dakota Waters and Beaver Bay going West, visitors will have a plethora of choices when picking their perfect camping spot. Call ahead for RV reservations or stop through for primitive camping. You won't regret great times at the lake!

2 MERCER COUNTY FAIR

July 14-17

Bring the family down for fun and entertainment. Parade Saturday July 16th down Main Street starts at 10:00am. Entertainment each evening featuring live music from various artists. Petting zoo, vendors and food daily. Carnival daily. FUN FOR EVERYONE.

3 DAKOTA WALLEYE CLASSIC

4 RIVERSIDE PARK



The home to over one hundred years of memories. It also has the memorial of Hometown Hero Hazel Miner, the 15 year old who gave her life to save her siblings in the blizzard of 1920.

16 SQUARE BUTTE CREEK GOLF COURSE

The Square Butte Golf Course is located 2 miles East of Center then 1 mile South. It is a hilly 9 hole course and has water hazards coming into play on two holes. Hole #1, a 150-yard, par 3, offers a scenic view and requires a downhill tee shot from the clubhouse. The course features 6296 yards from the Men's tees which plays to a par 72 for 18 holes.

Gas carts are available to rent while walking the course is permitted. Clubs are also available for rent. A full-service bar and restaurant are located on premises.

The pro shop opens at 8 a.m. most days. Green fees are \$20 for 9 holes, \$26 for 18 holes and \$31 for all day. Please call 794-3623 for more information.

17 CROSS RANCH STATE PARK

Open year-round

State park visitor center hours vary by season.

The state park charges a \$7/vehicle daily entry fee; an annual pass is available for \$35. Cross Ranch Preserve is free and open to the public from dawn to dusk.

Cross Ranch State Park offers a variety of events and interpretive activities throughout the year as well as camping, hiking, fishing and geocaching. Facilities include picnic shelters, a playground and a boat ramp, as well as log cabins, yurts and RV camping (under 35 feet, with showers and flush toilets nearby). Canoes are available for rent; in the winter, visitors can rent snowshoes or cross-country ski equipment.

The Cross Ranch Preserve, adjacent to Cross Ranch State Park, is free of charge and open to the public for hiking, wildlife and bird watching, photography and, in the winter, cross-country skiing. It is also a historic and archeological site, with the remnants of a pioneer homestead and cemetery visible from the trail.

18 GARRISON DAM


The largest dam in North Dakota provides not only hydroelectric power, but fantastic views for those driving over it. Situated between Pick City and Riverdale on North Dakota Highway 200, the dam separates Lake Sakakawea from the Missouri River and produces tons of energy.

19 GARRISON DAM NATIONAL FISH HATCHERY

The Fish Hatchery is situated just beneath Garrison Dam, to the east of the power plant. Visitors are welcome to walk the nature trails that surround the hatchery ponds and provide scenic views of the Missouri River. Juvenile eagles are a common sight. The Downstream Campground is located nearby, offering a large amount of riverside and lakeside recreation.

20 LAKE SAKAKAWEA STATE PARK



27 FLEA MARKET

In June, Hazen will have an excellent chance to do some summertime shopping in the beautiful outdoors. On June 21, Hazen will hold a Flea Market at the newly renovated Heritage Park. 22 BIKING AND HIKING

The Hazen area provides numerous opportunities for bikers and hikers to get around. Trails currently run parallel to Highway 200 from near Jimmy's Lounge to the golf clubhouse, as well as from Krause's Market east toward downtown. There are parks located along these trails as well. The Knife River Indian Villages National Park and Lake Sakakawea State Park are also less than an hour's drive away, featuring options for avid hikers.



23 BUFFALO VALLEY ARCHERY

Buffalo Valley Archery Club is the premier archery club in the area, offering up to a 20 yard indoor range to members as well as an outdoor range with a donation box. 24 HARMONY LAKE

While the big lake north occupies the most attention, there's another prime destination, halfway between Lake Sakakawea and the City of Hazen. Harmony Lake is the result of a recreational lake being established after Coteau Properties finished its mining operations in that area. At 38 acres in size, the man-made lake is stocked with panfish for anglers and has a boat dock for easy access. The winding lake and road alongside also provides a great opportunity for birders, hikers and anyone wanting to take advantage of a sunny day.



26 HAZEN GOLF COURSE

Located a half-mile east of Hazen on Highway 200, the 9-hole Hazen Golf Course boasts about 2,800 yards with a par of 35. Don't underestimate the challenge it brings. It features a No. 1 handicap par 3 known as "The shortest Par 5 in North Dakota."





28 HAZEN PARKS

Although Hazen is a town of only about 2,500 people, it boasts a lot of outdoor recreation at numerous parks right within its city limits. Nearly all residents live within a 10 minute walk of a park, where they can sit and enjoy a sunny day while their kids find ample opportunities to play. The parks in Hazen are diverse, ranging from the Riverside Park along the Knife River to the extensive walking/biking trails and playground sets at North Star II Park, from the small yet gorgeous Pocket Park in downtown to the newly renovated and expansive Heritage Park, perfect for outdoor events.



29 HAZEN BAY RECREATION AREA

If you want to enjoy the outdoors, the Hazen Bay Recreation Area, located 15 miles due north of Hazen on County Road 27, is the ideal place for you. The campground includes 95 full-site hook-ups, 25 sites with water and electric service, three sites with simple electric service, six primitive camp sites for diehard campers and six rental cabins (4 fully furnished and 2 primitive). Playgrounds and picnic shelters also offer locations to relax. Boat ramps and a fish cleaning station are also available for use by boaters and anglers. Hazen Bay also has two comfort stations and a convenience store.




40 FORT STEVENSON STATE PARK



54 AREA POWWOWS

The rhythm of drums calls to the soul as singers raise their voices with words that are as ancient as the hills or young as a new child. From the muted tones of the traditional dancers to the kaleidoscope that makes up the costumes of the fancy dancers, Powwows are a feast for the senses.

The Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara people have lived in the Missouri River Valley for centuries. The powwows are a connection to that past when peoples from hundreds of miles around came to the river to trade and celebrate the prairie's abundance. Powwows are also a time for special ceremonies to welcome new members into families and clans and remember those who have passed away.

Every reservation community on Fort Berthold holds at least one powwow during the summer. Powwows generally start Thursday evenings and go all day Friday and Saturday. The largest powwows on the Fort Berthold Reservation are:

55 STAY IN AN AUTHENTIC EARTH LODGE

The tribes of the Upper Missouri, the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara, built great cities centuries before Europeans came to North America. The River was sacred to the people and was also center of trade that stretched from the Gulf of Mexico to what is now Canada. In these cities, the people lived in Earth Lodges, buildings framed with huge cottonwood logs from the river and covered with finely woven branches and hides. Then the lodges were given a thick covering of the rich prairie soil that held back winter's biting chill and stayed cool in the heat of summer.

Today, tourist can experience the hospitality that Lewis and Clark enjoyed on their Voyage of Discovery and be welcomed at an Earth Lodge Village. Six miles west of New Town, on the shore of Lake Sakakawea, sits a small Earth Lodge Village that recreates those historical moments. The Village has six family sized lodges that can be rented and is also home to tipi encampments. The large ceremonial lodge which was completely rebuilt over the winter hosts storytelling and other cultural events.

Visitors can also drop in for a cultural tour, hiking, kayaking or horseback riding. Bikes and kayaks can be rented as well. The Earth Lodge Village is also the host of the exciting Warrior of the Plains race every summer. Visitors can also learn from the village's traditional garden, which grows ancient varieties of beans, corn, sunflowers and other traditional foods.

56 TAKE A SCENIC ROAD TRIP

Running through the heart of the regions rich history and its current oil boom, the Killdeer Mountain-Four Bears scenic byway tells the story of North Dakota.

Starting in the south on the banks of the Heart River near Manning, Highway 22 runs north to Killdeer, where Cowboy Country and Oil Country meet. Killdeer offers fishing and hiking at the Lake Ilo Wildlife Refuge. Travelers can wet their whistle and get a hearty meal at the Buckhorn Saloon. Just north of Killdeer is the Killdeer Mountain Battlefield State Historic Site which commemorates a battle fought on July 28, 1864, between troops commanded by General Sully and a gathering of Teton, Yanktonai, and Dakota (Sioux) Indians.

Some of the most picturesque Badlands scenery can be found at Little Missouri State Park. Most of this primitive park is accessible only on foot or horseback. Wind, water and sand ... these components sculpted North Dakota's wildly rugged Little Missouri Breaks Country. Called "Mako Shika" or "where the land breaks" by the Sioux, these unusual land formations offer the state's most awe-inspiring scenery. The park is located 15 miles south of Mandaree.

Just north of the park, the byway winds north through rugged badlands crossing the Little Missouri River at Lost Bridge. The Lost Bridge was built in the early 1930s. A road to the bridge was not built until twenty years later, hence the name. The Lost Bridge was dismantled in 1994. A plaque and a piece of the old bridge have been installed on Highway 22 near the new ridge as a memorial.

Mandaree is the hub of the West Segment of the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara Nation. There are many cultural events throughout the summer.. The community holds a festive Fourth of July celebration every year. The Mandaree Powwow grounds is the home of the Mandaree Celebration held on July 13-16 this summer.

The trip concludes at Four Bears, on the shores of Lake Sakakawea. Stops at the end of the road include the Three Affiliated Tribes Museum, the Four Bears Casino and Lodge, Four Bears Water Park, the spectacular Four Bears Bridge and the Crow Flies High Butte Scenic Overlook. Just across the bridge is historic New Town, with dining options including Teddy's Lounge, Better B's, JC Java Coffeeshop, TDH Cafe and more.





71 KNIFE RIVER INDIAN VILLAGES

(open year round)

Home of Sacagawea, the famous Shoshone woman who accompanied Lewis and Clark on their expedition, Knife River Indian Villages is a historic location featuring both the sites and artifacts of the Native American tribes that lived there: the Mandan, Hidatsa and Arikara. Now it is a national park that is open year round, while featuring special attractions, guest speakers, interactive exhibits and shows, and unique events through the summer.

72 MERCER COUNTY MEMORIAL

The recently expanded Mercer County Courthouse in Stanton features a beautiful Veterans Memorial Wall. The historic marker honors the names of men and women from Mercer County who served with the United State Armed Forces. In addition, the courthouse features an artifact collection.

73 ARRODA LAKE

Located in the hills east of Stanton along Alt.

The expedition camped nearby on April 17, 1805, and an interpretive trail marker has been placed within the park to commemorate their historic journey through North Dakota.

Lake Sakakawea offers excellent fishing for walleye, sauger, and northern pike and boating opportunities. The park also offers a swimming beach with washed sand. Two rare fish species, the pallid sturgeon and the prehistoric-looking paddlefish, can occasionally be found in the lake's western reaches.




82 4-H CAMP

84 FORT MANDAN



94 REMEMBER THE PIONEERS

The Pioneer Museum of McKenzie County packs a whole lot of history into a small area. From the exhibit on the last lynching in North Dakota to the replica of a pioneer home, the museum accurately depicts a large part of Watford City's and McKenzie County's history.

Visitors can follow the lives of the pioneers through a series of 14 historical wall panels that chronicle the dreams and aspirations of the first farmers, ranchers and townspeople to come to the area. Learn why whole families chose to leave their homes and settle in a new, wild country. Experience the joys and hardships of early life on the Great Plains.

You will be surprised to see a few new things at our museum especially the expanded (doubled the size of this area!) and renovated lower level where we are largely exploring the economic development of McKenzie County. New and featured oil history exhibits showcasing then and particularly now (nothing else like this in the State of North Dakota), and of course the ranching and farming history with a then and now twist. We did not forget the kiddos! An area where they can learn about farming, seeds and the Very Hungry McKenzie County Caterpillar! There are a couple finishing touches that will be added, but largely completed.

Add the fully stocked gift shop to the Pioneer Museum experience and you will have a very enjoyable time! We stock Theodore Roosevelt National Park items, t-shirts, Carrie Carson Pottery, and Barb Boltz Crafty Products. So lots to take a peek at!

The Parlor, on the upper level of the museum, has all the comforts of home. It includes an Honor Display dedicated to the Pioneer Women of McKenzie County. Some of the exhibits in the Parlor include Clothing Styles of Yesteryear, Prairie School, Sewing and Quilting, Homestead Living and an Old Time Photo Collection. On the lower lever there is a traveling exhibit room and displays on Early Farming and Ranching and Oil and Gas Exploration.

A special exhibit documents one of the darker moments in the county's history. Charles Bannon murdered the Albert Haven family in February 1930. He was taken from the local jail by a mob and hanged from the Schafer Bridge on January 29, 1931. This was the last recorded lynching in North Dakota.

The museum is located in the Long X Visitors Center, Corner of U.S. Highway. 85 South & West, Watford City. Stop by Grandma's Pantry & Book Corner on the main floor of the Visitor Center. Open 10 a.m.-6 p.m. Monday thru Saturday. Admission is \$2 for adults and \$1 for children. Group rates and special passes are available. For more information call 701-444-2990.


