North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame to induct one new member

The North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame Board of Directors is pleased to announce the upcoming induction of Robert "Bob" Meter of Bismarck to the Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony will occur in Garrison on July 18th at the City Auditorium. The induction will be conducted prior to the rules meeting for the Governor's Cup Walleye Derby.

The mission of the North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame is to conduct and maintain a program to recognize and honor those persons, organizations, or institutions that have made significant and lasting contributions to sportfishing in North Dakota. This year's inductee has made significant contributions that makes him well qualified for induction into the Hall of Fame.

Robert "Bob" Meter

Bob Meter is the inventor of a variety of fishing tackle items, but he is best known for the Meter Bottom Bouncer which vaulted walleye fishing in the Dakotas and ultimately the rest of the walleye waters across the country into a new angling technique. Invented by Bob in 1964, the bottom bouncer is used in conjunction with a spinner or plain hook rig, allowing anglers to drift or troll the rig on the bottom, while remaining relatively snag free. The Bottom Bouncer proved to be a classic, and has allowed untold numbers of anglers to successfully catch walleyes and other species on reservoirs, lakes, and rivers.

Bob was a founding father of the Bis-Man Reel & Rec club which was organized in 1979. He also originated the Take-a-Kid Fishing Program for the club. Bob was a tireless volunteer for a variety of fishing events, especially those involving boat and water safety or youth- related seminars and events. He was an avid angler and tournament fisherman. In addition to his bottom bouncer, other tackle he invented and marketed allowed him to place high in a number of walleye tournaments, including the North Dakota Governor's Walleye Cup.

Bob's tackle inventions have been invaluable to sport-fishing in North Dakota. He also displayed an unselfish dedication to help and educate others, positively promote sport-fishing, and volunteer his time and talents.

The North Dakota Fishing Hall of Fame is located at North Country Marine & Motorsports in Garrison, North Dakota. In addition to a display of all members of the Hall of Fame, there is a display of fishing artifacts. Past inductees to the Hall of Fame are:



Catch the Feeling

Summer fishing success often depends on finding those locations where walleyes are feeding, cruising and schooling.W Detecting those prime pieces of underwater real estate comes down to a matter of feel, and keeping contact with the bottom is a great way to detect those transition areas from sand or mud to gravel or larger rocks, which provide cover and edge habitat for Ol' Marbleyes. Utilizing a bottom bouncer and any number of related lures pulled behind it will help provide vital clues and a way of connecting with fish once key transition areas are identified.

The leg of a bottom bouncer does more than just prop a spinner or slow death rig up and prevent it from snagging in structure, it can also be used to feel out the bottom as it is pulled along behind the boat. A steady pull signifies a consistent bottom, like mud, clay, sand or sometimes flat rock. A tick-tick usually suggests gravel or other small-rock substrates. A larger jump or pull on the rod tip will signal the wire bouncing off a bigger rock or boulder. Putting the pattern together, anytime a bottom bouncer slips from a smooth surface to a more broken one, a key transition area is identified and is worth noting on a lake map or a GPS – especially if a bite follows.

Utilize low-stretch superline like PowerPro, Fireline or the like on a sensitive graphite rod to get a more sensitive connection to the specialized sinker. Hold the rod in hand to get a feel as to what things are like below as the information telegraphs up the line and compare what's detected by touch with what can be seen on a sonar screen. Where more than one rod is an option, have a second bottom bouncer rig on a reel loaded with monofilament and set in a nearby rod holder. While the more sensitive (and less stretchy) superline can be used to detect changes and bites can be handled with a drop-sweep



hookset by hand, the rod rigged with monofilament can play a little bit and load up against the weight of a fish if it bites. Just remember to frequently check the rig in the rod holder while trolling along.

Not unlike pheasants, deer or other wildlife, walleyes utilize edges for feeding, travel and, if needed, a quick escape to cover, such as a deeper stretch nearby or a rockier area that provides more concealment. As prey items such as perch or other small panfish often utilize the same edges, these areas are worth noting and fishing with more rigor once they are detected. Finding spots in both deep and shallow water and adjusting presentations based on weather conditions or daylight is an effective way of being able to move between prime areas during low light and daytime hours. By running spinners or other similar trolling rigs on a bottom bouncer, the rig provides a two-in-one seek-and-connect combination for walleyes in any stretch where a transition area occurs.

Beyond the obvious purpose of presenting a bait in the strike zone to summer walleyes, bottom bouncers, when partnered with sensitive no-stretch line and a good rod, can explain a lot about why fish are relating to a certain area in a body of water. Utilize them to get a feel for those prime places that walleyes use this time of year to recover from the spawn and feed straight into fall. Wherever the changes are detected in the substrate below, it is likely that fish will follow. Be ready for the bite and make it a point to mark those places for great fishing all season long.







ND Governor's Cup Rules

2019 Rules

WE HAVE BEEN WORKING CLOSELY WITH THE NORTH DAKOTA GAME AND FISH DEPARTMENT IN AN EFFORT TO MAKE THE 2019 NORTH DAKOTA GOVERNOR'S CUP POSSIBLE.

- 1. THE WESTERN BOUNDARY WILL BE FROM THE NORTH SHORE OF BERTHOLD BAY ON THE NORTH WITH AN IMAGINARY LINE STRETCHING ACROSS TO THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE LAKE.
- 2. BOATS MAY COME BY WATER TO BE INSPECTED AT THE DOCK IN GARRISON BAY. IN ORDER TO WEIGH FISH, TEAMS MUST TRAILER THEIR BOATS AND TAKE THEM INTO TOWN TO THE GARRISON CITY PARK WHERE THE WEIGH-IN WILL BE HELD.
- 3. THERE WILL BE NO MINIMUM LENGTH LIMIT ON FISH WEIGHED IN.
- 4. YOUR PATIENCE DURING LAUNCHING AND WEIGH-IN WILL BE GREATLY APPRECIATED.
- 5. NUMBER OF FISH PER TEAM: CATCH 8 FISH, WEIGH 5 FISH EACH DAY. TOTAL 10 FISH FOR 2 DAY TOTAL. 5 FISH PER DAY MAX.

1. Eligibility

A) All persons 18 years of age or older are eligible to enter the 43rd annual North Dakota Governor's Walleye Cup Tournament. Anglers under 18 must fish with a parent or guardian.

2. Requirements

- A) Each contestant must have in his/her possession a valid fishing license.
- B) All contestants are required to observe U.S. Coast Guard and N.D. Game and Fish Department rules and regulations concerning safe boating.
- ALL CURRENT NORTH DAKOTA GAME AND FISH DE-PARTMENT

REGULATIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED.

- C) Promoters and organizations assisting in tournament operation, their agencies and agents are not responsible for death, injury, damage, liability, theft, fire or any loss to any entrants. Each entrant, upon signing an accepted entry form, will in effect be signing a waiver form.
- D) Each entrant will be required to have a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal floating device (PFD).
- E) Each entrant will be urged to wear a PFD at all times while in the boat.

3. Fishing

- A) In the Governor's Cup only walleye, sauger and saugeye will be included in official totals.
- B) Only those fish caught on a hook and line in formal and usual manner will be accepted.
- C) Each fisherman will be allowed TWO (2) LINES in the water at a time. Spare rods and equipment may be carried in the boat.
- D) Live bait and artificial lures are allowed. Electronic and electrical luring or attracting devices are prohibited.
- E) Any fish mangled or altered in any way to either lengthen or shorten it, will be weighed and credited at the discretion of the weigh-in officials. Their decision is final. A team may not fish to replace a disqualified fish.
- F) Entrants will conduct themselves as true sportsmen and gentlemen when fishing near another boat. No boat may touch another boat.
- G) A contestant MUST NOT leave the boat to land a fish or to untangle lines or lures.
 - H) During tournament fishing hours, contestants must not

solicit, share, or receive fishing information pertaining to method or type of presentations being used or location of fish with other contestants or non-contestants.

4. Boats and Equipment

- A) All boats will be required to meet U.S. Coast Guard safety regulations.
- B) All boats will be required to carry a state registration in accordance with the regulations of the home state of the contestant owning the boat.
- C) Boat may be equipped with electronic positioning or trolling motors.
- E) Electronic and electrical depth finders, thermometers, oxygen meters, etc. are allowed.

5. Tournament Boundaries

- A) Tournament teams may not fish west of the boundaries during tournament hours.
- B) Fishing will be permitted in an area east of the west point of Berthold Bay on the north and an imaginary line stretching across to the south side of the lake, stretching east to the Garrison Dam and Highway 83 on the eastern boundary.
- C) Tournament teams may not cross the imaginary line stretching south from the west point of Berthold Bay during tournament hours.

6. Weigh-in

- A) The scale for the weigh-in will be open throughout the fishing day.
- B) Each team will be responsible for their own catch. Under no circumstances may anyone other than the contestants handle or touch the catch until after it has been presented to the weigh-in officials at the scale.
- C) A team member must accompany the catch to the scale. Each team will receive a copy of their scale ticket each time their team weighs in fish. The team member must check weight ticket for accuracy before leaving the stage area.
- D) An unloading area will be designated immediately in front of the weigh-in area and will be for unloading of fish only.

7. Required Activities

- A) REGISTRATION WILL BEGIN AT NOON ON JULY 18TH AND CLOSE AT 6:30 PM. IF TEAMS HAVEN'T REGISTERED BY THIS TIME, REGISTRATION WILL OPEN AGAIN AFTER THE RULES MEETING.
- B) All contestants are required to attend the pre-tournament rules meeting which will be held at 7 p.m. in the Garrison City Auditorium on July 18, 2019.
- C) Any contestants involved in a protest must be on call for three (3) hours following the end of the fishing day.
- D) All contestants are required to cooperate with members of the press for interviews and photographs.

8. Fishing Hours and Starting

- A) The tournament fishing day will begin at 7 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday with Sunday reserved as a storm makeup day. All boats must be inspected and must receive their identifying marker before they will be allowed to leave in their respective flight.
- B) Contestants who return late will be penalized five (5) percent of their total weight for each minute late and will be disqualified for any large walleye prize.
- C) The Fort Stevenson Park area will serve as tournament headquarters any contestants will be required to start and end each day at this point.
- D) Boats will be leaving in four flights accompanied by pace boats. The flights will alternate each day.
- E) All boats must pass the check boat when moving to flight departure area.

2019 ND Governor's Cup Rules continued

- 9. Boat Identification and Patrolling
- A) All contestants' boats will be identified with a colored decal. Team numbers will be assigned. Decal must be placed on the left side of the boat.
- B) If an emergency exists, patrol boat personnel will be clearly marked for easy identification.
- C) Boats may be inspected before and during the tournament. Tournament officials will be checking boats at the launch area and patrol boats will be intensively patrolling the fishing areas. Any cheating will result in immediate disqualification, if protests are upheld.

10. Prizes

- A) Prizes will be based on most weight (pounds) during the two days of the tournament.
 - B) Prizes will be awarded on a team basis.
- C) In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the team with the earliest team entry number.
- D) Prizes will be awarded on the final day but are subject to final checks by the committee. All cash prizes will be mailed no later than one month after tournament concludes.
- E) Polygraph test may be given to the top winners of the tournament and other prize winners the committee deem necessary. The test would be given as soon as possible following the tournament.
 - F) Payoff in cash prizes is based on 252 team field

11. Contingency Prizes

- A) Contingency prizes may be offered by contributors, supporters, or other interested parties.
- B) Rules for contingency prizes will be stipulated by those offering the prize.

12. "Spirit of the Rule"

A) All rules have "loopholes". It is the intention of the sponsor

to provide an honest sportsmanlike tournament in the interest of good sportsmanship. Contestants are reminded that "spirit of the rule" will prevail in all judgment cases.

13. Protests

- A) Any contestant has the right to make a protest against another contestant. A protest form is available from the tournament chairman and should be filled out and presented to the chairman within one hour of the close of the fishing day.
- B) A \$150 protest fee will be required to accompany any formal protest. The fee is to be returned if the protest is found valid by the protest committee. If invalid, the fee will not be returned.

14. Miscellaneous

- A) All questions or problems concerning the rules of this tournament are to be referred to the tournament committee chairman.
- B) If one of the two team members drops out before the tournament, he may be replaced by the choice of the remaining team member. The chairman must be notified of the change before the tournament.
- C) If an entire team drops out, the place will be filled by the tournament chairman and not by the choice of the team that drops out, and the entry fee will be returned only if notice is given by June 26th.
- D) Fishermen (contestants) are not allowed to fish within tournament boundaries if a day of fishing is cancelled due to inclement weather.
 - E) Fish may be donated.
