DOUBLE DOWN ON BOATING SAFETY THIS SUMMER

BY DOUG LEIER DAKOTA EDGE OUTDOORS

A reader emailed recently to suggest that I should focus less in my columns on safety, as "it takes the fun away from being outdoors."

I do always consider that "too much" factor when I write

to click in before driving off. And who would argue about that? While it's impossible to plan the best time to wear a seat belt or not, it just makes

sense to wear one all the time. The premise for wearing a personal flotation device while in a boat isn't much different. While regulations don't

should wear a life jacket with four nylon straps rather than one with a zipper, because straps are stronger than zippers upon impact with water. Anglers or anyone paddling a canoe should opt for a PFD that is comfortable enough to wear for an entire outing.

Water skiers and tubers are reminded it takes three to ski and tube. When a person is towed on water skis or a similar device, an observer other than the operator is required on the vessel or the personal watercraft is equipped with a mirror on each side which provides the operator an unobstructed field

or talk about safety, but I've also seen enough injuries and dead bodies, especially early in my career when I was a game warden, to let one person or complaint change my tune.

Safety and habitat are two important topics to most of us who spend time in the outdoors. If you don't have a safe fishing, boating or hunting trip, it doesn't matter how many hours you spend on the pontoon, if you bring home a limit of fish or tag a trophy buck.

Likewise, without habitat, pike, perch, deer and pheasant numbers will struggle to provide the opportunities for creating special memories.

I grew up in the 1980s when recommendations for seatbelt use were turning into laws, and people were trying to adjust to the process of having

require mandatory wearing of PFDs for anyone age 11 or older on North Dakota waters, if an accident does happen, it's usually too late for the PFD to do any good.

It certainly isn't surprising that national statistics show failure to wear a PFD is the main reason people lose their lives in water recreation accidents.

North Dakota law requires all children ages 10 and younger to wear a personal flotation device at all times while in boats of less than 27 feet in length. State law also requires an approved PFD on board for older passengers, and all personal watercraft users must wear a life jacket, as well as anyone towed on skis, tubes, boards or other similar devices. Water skiers and tubers



ESSENTIALS TACKLE BOX

2021 ND Governor's Walleye Cup Derby 3

• Extra fishing line: Lines get snagged, torn or snapped when reeling in a great catch, so extra fishing line is essential.

• **Extra hooks:** The traditional J-hook can snag many types of fish, but some anglers like a French hook. No matter which hook you prefer, make sure you have a variety of sizes on hand so you can switch if need be.

• A set of fishing pliers: Purchase pliers specifically made for fishing. Most come in aluminum so they will not corrode due to the elements. Also, if you're using braided fishing line, be sure the pliers have a cutter made for cutting braid.

• **Bobbers in various sizes:** Bobbers, also called floaters, help anglers know when a fish is biting. Round clip-on bobbers are popular and widely available. Slip bobbers will slide up and down the line, enabling anglers to get the hook into deeper water.

• **Sinkers:** The yin to the bobber's yang, sinkers are weights that help weigh down a worm or artificial lure to reach the right level to attract fish.


• **Fishing regulations/ruler:** A variety of rules govern when and where you can fish. Also, you'll need to know which size fish are keepers and which need to be tossed back. Keep a regulation ruler in the tackle box to avoid fines.

• **Pocket knife:** Keep a sharp knife for cutting lines and bait. Reserve a special filet knife for cleaning fish.

• Selection of lures: Research which fish you're angling for and then purchase a variety of appropriate lures. Some lures will attract a wide array of fish.

• **Stringer:** A stringer is a device that is used to hold several caught fish through their gills. It anchors to land and the other end with the fish on it is placed in the water to keep the fish alive until you're ready to pack up and go. It's a good alternative to a cooler or bucket filled with water.

• **Fishing license:** Many conservation or fish and wildlife departments require a license for fishing for anglers of a certain age. Be sure to have it on hand or you may be susceptible to fines or other penalties.





1. Eligibility

A) All persons 18 years of age or older are eligible to enter the 46th annual North Dakota Governor's Walleye Cup Tournament. Anglers under 18 must fish with a parent or guardian.

2. Requirements

A) Each contestant must have in his/her possession a valid fishing license.

B) All contestants are required to observe U.S. Coast Guard and N.D. Game and Fish Department rules and regulations concerning safe boating.

ALL CURRENT NORTH DA-KOTA GAME AND FISH DEPART-MENT REGULATIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED.

C) Promoters and organizations assisting in tournament operation, their agencies and agents are not responsible for death, injury, damage, liability, theft, fire or any loss to any entrants. Each entrant, upon signing an accepted entry form, will in effect be signing a waiver form.

D) Each entrant will be required to have a U.S. Coast Guard approved personal floating device (PFD).

E) Each entrant will be urged to wear a PFD at all times while in the boat.

3. Fishing

A) NUMBER OF FISH PER TEAM: TEAMS MAY CATCH 8 FISH, WEIGH 5 FISH EACH DAY. TOTAL 10 FISH FOR 2 DAY TO-TAL.

B) In the Governor's Cup only walleye, sauger and saugeye will be included in official totals. There will be no minimum length limit on fish weighed in.

C) Only those fish caught on a hook and line in formal and usual manner will be accepted.

D) Each fisherman will be allowed TWO (2) LINES in the water at a time. Spare rods and equipment may be carried in the boat.

E) Live bait and artificial lures are allowed. Electronic and electrical luring or attracting devices are prohibited.

F) Any fish mangled or altered in any way, will be weighed and credited at the discretion of the weigh-in officials. Their decision is final. A team may not fish to replace a disqualified fish.

G) Entrants will conduct themselves as true sportsmen and gentlemen when fishing near another boat. No boat may touch another boat.

H) A contestant MUST NOT leave the boat to land a fish or to untangle lines or lures.

I) During tournament fishing hours, contestants must not solicit, share, or receive fishing information pertaining to method or type of C) Tournament teams may not cross the imaginary line stretching south from the west point of Berthold Bay during tournament hours. **6. Weigh-in**

A) The scale for the weigh-in will be open throughout the fishing day at the Garrison City Park.

B) Each team will be responsible for their own catch. Under no circumstances may anyone other than the contestants handle or touch the catch until after it has been presented to the weigh-in officials at the scale.

C) A team member must accompany the catch to the scale. Each team will receive a copy of their scale ticket each time their team weighs in fish. The team member must check weight ticket for accuracy before leaving the stage area.

D) An unloading area will be designated immediately in front of the weigh-in area and will be for unloading of fish only.

E) YOUR PATIENCE DURING WEIGH-IN IS GREATLY APPRE-CIATED.

7. Required Activities

A) REGISTRATION WILL BEGIN AT NOON ON JULY 15TH AND CLOSE AT 6:30 PM. IF TEAMS HAVEN'T REGISTERED BY THIS TIME, REGISTRATION WILL OPEN AGAIN AFTER THE RULES MEETING.

B) All contestants are required to attend the pre-tournament rules meeting which will be held at 7 p.m. in the Garrison City Auditorium on July 15, 2021.

C) Any contestants involved in a protest must be on call for three (3) hours following the end of the fishing day.

D) All contestants are required to cooperate with members of the press for interviews and photographs.

8. Fishing Hours

A) The tournament fishing day will begin at 7 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. Friday and Saturday with Sunday reserved as a storm makeup day. All boats must be inspected and must receive their identifying marker before they will be allowed to leave in their respective flight.

B) Contestants who return late will be penalized five (5) percent of their total weight for each minute late and will be disqualified for any large walleye prize.

ND Governor's Cup 2021 Rules

C) The Fort Stevenson Park area and Garrison City Park will serve as tournament headquarters any contestants will be required to start and end each day at these locations.

D) Boats will be leaving in four flights accompanied by pace boats. The flights will alternate each day.

E) All boats must pass the check boat when moving to flight departure area.

9. Boat Identification and Patrolling

A) All contestants' boats will be identified with a colored decal. Team numbers will be assigned. Decal must be placed on the left side of the boat.

B) If an emergency exists, patrol boat personnel will be clearly marked for easy identification.

C) Tournament officials will be checking boats at the launch area and patrol boats will be intensively patrolling the fishing areas. Boats may be inspected before and during the tournament. Any cheating will result in immediate disqualification, if protests are upheld.

D) boats may come by water to be inspected at the dock in Garrison Bay. In order to weigh fish, teams must trailer their boats and take them into town to the garrison city park where the weigh-in will be held. E) YOUR PATIENCE DURING

LAUNCHING & INSPECTIONS IS GREATLY APPRECIATED. 10. Prizes

A) Prizes will be based on most weight (pounds) during the two days of the tournament.

B) Prizes will be awarded on a team basis.

C) In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the team with the earliest team entry number.

D) Prizes will be awarded on the final day but are subject to final checks by the committee. All cash prizes will be mailed no later than one month after tournament concludes.

E) Polygraph test may be given to the top winners of the tournament and other prize winners the committee deem necessary. The test would be given as soon as possible following the tournament.

F) Payoff in cash prizes is based on 260 team field.

11. Contingency Prizes

 A) Contingency prizes may be offered by contributors, supporters, or other interested parties.

B} Rules for contingency prizes will be stipulated by those offering the prize.

12. "Spirit of the Rule"

A) All rules have "loopholes". It is the intention of the sponsor to provide an honest sportsmanlike tournament in the interest of good sportsmanship. Contestants are reminded that "spirit of the rule" will prevail in all judgment cases.
 13. Protests

A) Any contestant has the right to make a protest against another contestant. A protest form is available from the tournament chairman and should be filled out and presented to the chairman within one hour of the close of the fishing day.

B) A \$150 protest fee will be required to accompany any formal protest. The fee is to be returned if the protest is found valid by the protest committee. If invalid, the fee will not be returned.

14. Miscellaneous

A) All questions or problems concerning the rules of this tournament are to be referred to the tournament committee chairman.

B) If one of the two team members drops out before the tournament, he may be replaced by the choice of the remaining team member. The chairman must be notified of the change before the tournament.

C) If an entire team drops out, the place will be filled by the tournament chairman and not by the choice of the team that drops out, and the entry fee will be returned only if notice is given by June 26th.

D) Fishermen (contestants) are not allowed to fish within tournament boundaries if a day of fishing is cancelled due to inclement weather. E) Fish may be donated.

4. Boats and Equipment

A) All boats will be required to meet U.S. Coast Guard safety regulations.

B) All boats will be required to carry a state registration in accordance with the regulations of the home state of the contestant owning the boat.

C) Boat may be equipped with electronic positioning or trolling motors.

E) Electronic and electrical depth finders, thermometers, oxygen meters, etc. are allowed.

5. Tournament Boundaries

A) Tournament teams may not fish west of the boundaries during tournament hours.

B) Fishing will be permitted in an area east of the west point of Berthold Bay on the north and an imaginary line stretching across to the south side of the lake, stretching east to the Garrison Dam and Highway 83 on the eastern boundary.


