Elinor West Sept. 25, 1925 - Jan. 11, 2024


Elinor worked in nursing positions in ND, MN, and OR, retiring in 1983. She enjoyed reading, knitting, sewing, bicycling and gardening.

Dec. 11, 1938 - Feb. 29, 2024



ing his grand-fur babies, Scooby, Shadow, Sasha, Hunter, Bruno, Checkers and Lucifer.




Helen Zimmerman May 16, 1932 - Mar. 29, 2024

Aug. 3, 1929 - May 26, 2024



Craig Johansen Nov 5. 1954 - June 3, 2024




Sept. 20, 1942 - July 3, 2024


Betty Affeldt Oct. 16, 1930 - July 5, 2024

May 7, 1932 - Aug. 15, 2024




so would she.
