

# Parade brings fun to downtown

While many events get going Friday at the fairgrounds, downtown Underwood will be busy Saturday just before noon as folks start lining up along Lincoln Ave. to take in the McLean County Fair Parade. The Grand Marshal will be Amanda Huettl, the 2023 Heartland Association of Fairs, Fair Person of the Year, line up starts at 11 am.

It's a BYOBFC (bring your own bag for candy) event for the kiddies, as they're encouraged to also wait along the street as the parade participants make their way through the parade route that starts at the McLean County Fairgrounds and makes its way down Lincoln Ave.

This is the 68th annual fair, and the parade promises to be filled with classic cars, buggies, antique tractors, horseback riders, fire trucks, military vehicles, and business and organization floats.

It's time for organizations to put their crepe paper and chicken wire skills to work again, as county organizations and businesses are encouraged to enter the parade. What a perfect way to get your business or organization name out to the public and get involved with locals from throughout the county.

Units will assemble at the fairgrounds entrance on old Highway 83 bypass loop at 11 a.m., and the parade will start at noon.





All ages are invited to bring their entries to the McLean County Fair for Judging and Premium dollars or simply for display. Items (other than the Vintage Division) must not have been entered in a previous open class at the McLean County Fair. They must be clean and made by the exhibitor in the last year.

No more than one (1) entry will be allowed under the same "Lot" number, except as collections or displays. Label each entry according to their "Division", "Class", "Lot", and age group. Age groups are: "Junior" -18yrs. and under, "Adult" - 19yrs. and above or, "Men Only".

Entry tags must be on all exhibits and will be available at the fairgrounds or you may call Diane Schell 701-220-3841. Entries will be received on Thursday June 13th from 5:00 p.m. -8:00 p.m. and Friday, June 14th from 8:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. Judging will begin at 1p.m. Help will be available to choose the correct category for your exhibit. Check out time will be Sunday, June 16th at 5:30 p.m. Any entries removed before that time will forfeit their premium dollars.

First place (blue ribbon) in each lot receives \$5, second place (red ribbon) \$4, and third place (white ribbon) \$3, all other entries will receive a participation ribbon. Items having no competition are awarded according to the Judge's decision. In the event of less than three entries in a lot, judges are not required to give a blue ribbon if they feel the entry, is not blue-ribbon quality. A \$10 cash prize will be given to the exhibitor with the most entries.

Open Class exhibits will be available for public viewing; Friday (after the judging is complete) until 10 p.m.; Saturday 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.; and Sunday 10 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Exhibits release at 5:30 p.m. Sunday - no early releases.

We welcome any new or unusual articles for display.

Harvested grain samples are handpicked samples, free of foreign matter and seed. One (1) quart glass jar minimum sample is required for small grains and large seeded crops.


